Term 4 ended just as Term 1 began with fantastic trips where we all had fun with the learning.


I learnt quite a bit more about cattle breeding (thanks Cody) and the students kept moving forwards with their learning too. Well done. See you in Get Together EVERYONE!

My name is Jo Byrne and I am lucky enough to be the Year 1/2 teacher at SOTA next year!




Hello,
